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## **New England Institute of Technology Returns to All In-Person Classes for the July Term**

East Greenwich, RI – Scott Freund, Executive Vice President at New England Institute of Technology (NEIT), announced that the university increased in-person classes for the Spring 2021 term (begins March 29<sup>th</sup>) and that **all** classes will be in person for the Summer 2021 term (begins July 19, 2021) and subsequent terms. NEIT will continue to follow the COVID-19 guidance and regulations provided by the Rhode Island Department of Health, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and the state government. Class delivery methods may be modified as COVID-19 conditions warrant. On-campus housing will remain open and continue to operate following COVID-19 safety protocols.

“Our administration, faculty and staff are looking forward to safely welcoming back all students for full in-person instruction on July 19<sup>th</sup>,” stated Freund. “Our students and faculty have worked diligently during the past several months as they continued to modify teaching and learning strategies through hybrid class delivery.
