New England Institute of Technology Announces the Return of its High School Tech Camp Program

East Greenwich, RI – New England Institute of Technology will host a series of Tech Camp programs for students attending 8th through 12th grades this fall. Campers can choose from a variety of exciting programs to explore with a focus on hands-on activities and build a foundational skill set they can use throughout their educational journey.

New England Tech's industry-leading faculty will instruct each camp which runs from 9:00 am – 2:00 pm daily at one of NEIT's three campuses using the same classrooms and labs NEIT degree candidates utilize so campers can experience what it's like to learn in a college setting.

Camps will run in two sessions from June 26-30, 2023 and July 10-13, 2023. Session 1 camps include Automotive Technology, Television Production, Audio Production, Digital Photography, Robotics and Drones, and Criminal Justice. Session 2 camps will offer Architecture and Entrepreneurship. Automotive Technology and Digital Photography camps are offered to 9th through12th grade students while all other camps are available to 8th through 12th grade participants.
